Announcements and Club Business

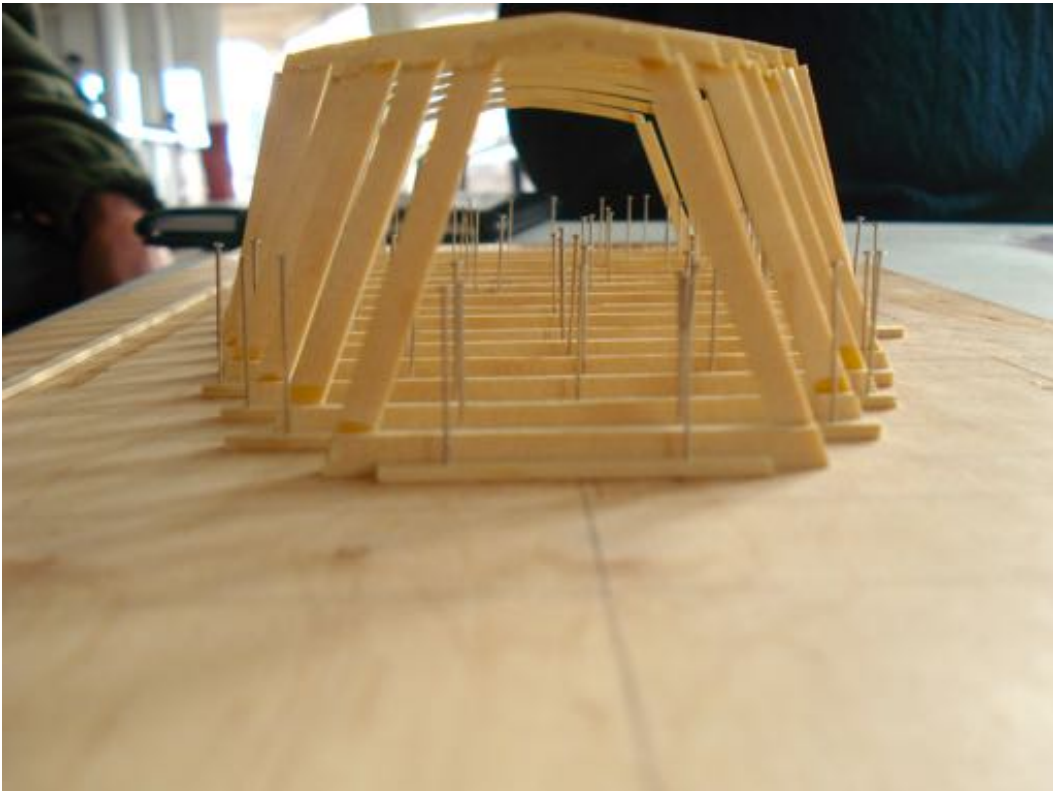
Dues are Due Please give your \$24 to Paul Reck at the next meeting to keep your membership current.

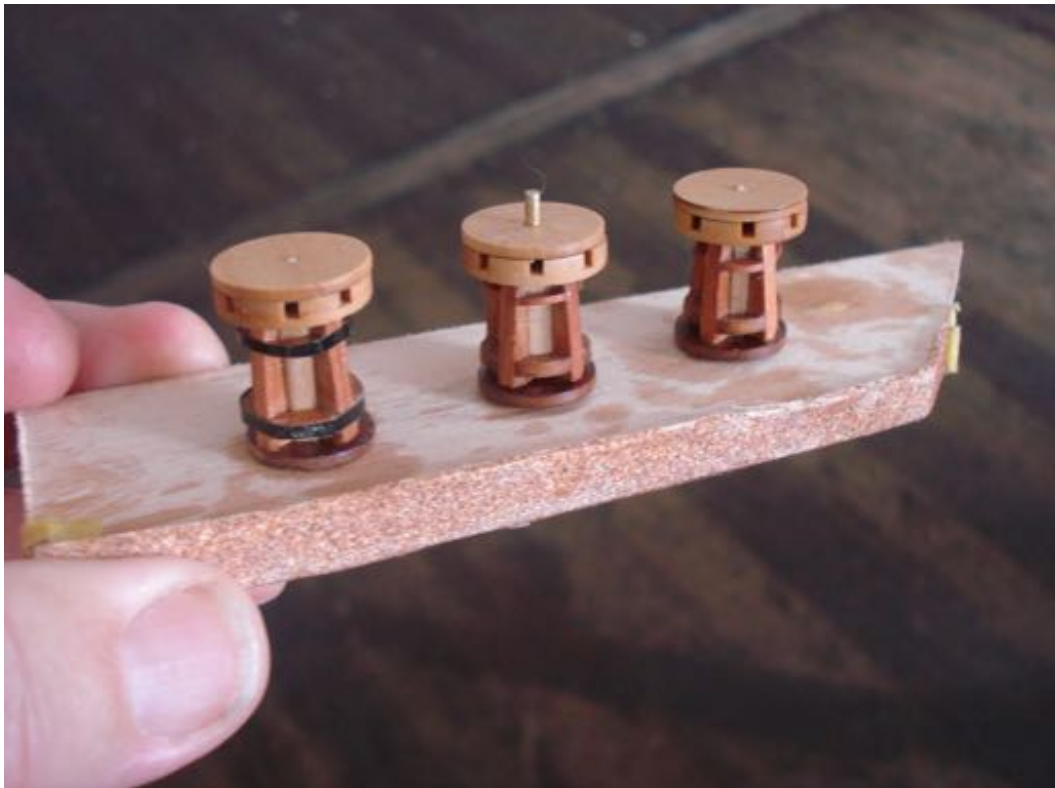

He had some questions about getting everything centered right. With the frames held in place, we can get a nice picture of the shape of the boat.



Paul Reck is apparently very busy with projects, having finished a half-hull of a Cal 34, repaired a Brigantine model and put in a proposal to build a model of a Morris 52' day sailor. Meanwhile, he brought in his battle-scarred cutter LEE that he will be repairing after it was knocked off a shelf by a newly acquired kitten.



Leo Kane is working hard on his scratch-built plank-on-frame model of the frigate Essex. He brought in some beautifully made capstans that he built for his model and they are masterfully done.



Clare Hess brought in his card model of the naval cutter HMS Alert. The 1/8" scale model is built from a kit produced in Poland by a company called Shipyard. Since last time it was brought in the caprails and some timberheads have been added. Progress will be slow as this is something of a side project.
