Paul Reck is checking on a model someone wants restored.

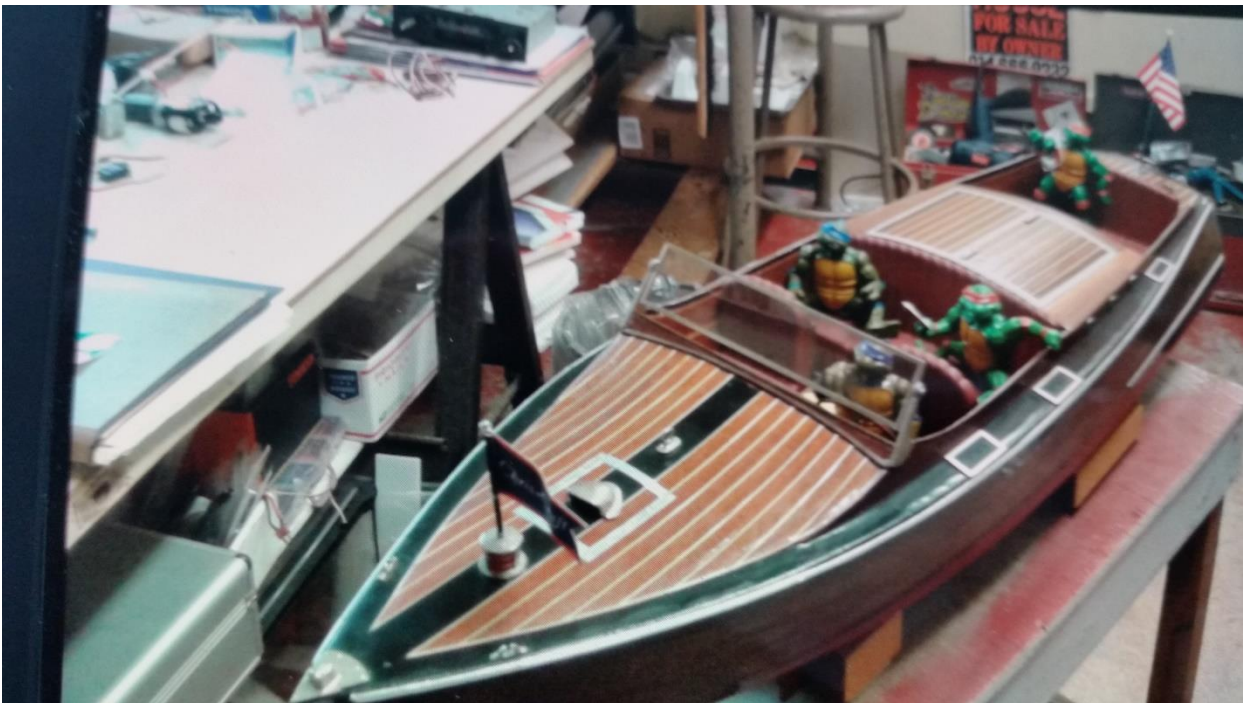
The annual NRG Conference is in St. Petersburg Florida this year
